Early in 1998, a number of head and neck oncologists from the disciplines of surgery, radiation oncology and medical oncology met in Sydney to discuss the feasibility of establishing a multidisciplinary head and neck cancer society. A working party was formed and following a number of meetings, invitations were sent to individuals in these three specialties to become foundation members of the Australian and New Zealand Head & Neck Cancer Society.

The initial business meeting was held on December 9, 1998 and at that time there were 60 foundation members. The Society adopted as its Constitution the Model Rules for Associations published by the Department of Fair Trading in NSW and the members agreed that their principal objectives would be to promote the practice of head and neck oncology, to educate medical colleagues and the public about our specialty, to foster research and to seek optimal treatment outcomes for our patients.

The meeting is designed for health professionals working in the area of head and neck oncology including; ENT surgeons, plastic and reconstructive surgeons, head and neck surgeons, oral and maxillofacial surgeons, medical oncologists, surgical oncologists including endocrine surgeons, radiation oncologists, registrars, speech pathologists, nurses, dietitians, psychologists, medical students and other health professionals.

Keynote Speakers



Dr Ehab Hanna Houston, USA

Ehab Y. Hanna, M.D., FACS, is Professor and Vice Chair of the Department of Head and Neck Surgery with a joint appointment in the Department of Neurosurgery and also serves as an Adjunct Professor of Otolaryngology, Otorhinolaryngology and Communicative Sciences, Head and Neck Surgery at Baylor College of Medicine. He is an internationally recognized head and

neck surgeon and expert in the treatment of patients with skull base tumors and head and neck cancer. He is the medical director of the Multidisciplinary Head and Neck Center and co-director of the Skull Base Tumor program. Dr Hanna is leading the development of minimally invasive and robotic applications in skull base surgery. In addition to patient care, Dr Hanna is actively engaged in clinical and translational research with emphasis on skull base tumors. Dr Hanna is the past president of the North American Skull Base Society (2014) and the past President of the American Head and Neck Society (2018). He is the Editor-in-Chief of the journal of Head & Neck, which is the official journal of the International Federation of Head and Neck Societies.



Dr Justin Roe London, UK

Dr Justin Roe is a Consultant and Professional Lead for Speech and Language Therapy at the Royal Marsden NHS Foundation Trust in London. He is also the Clinical Service Lead at the National Centre for Airway Reconstruction/ Laryngology Service at Imperial College Healthcare NHS Trust. He is an Honorary Clinical Senior Lecturer in the Department of Surgery and Cancer

at Imperial College London.

Dr Roe was awarded a PhD in 2013 from the Institute of Cancer Research in London, after evaluating functional and quality of life outcomes following treatment with intensity-modulated radiotherapy (IMRT) in people diagnosed with head and neck cancer. He is now actively involved in a number of high-profile Cancer Research UK and National Institute for Health Research (NIHR) portfolio studies and currently receives funding from the NIHR Imperial Biomedical Research Centre.

He has contributed to key policy and position papers, acting as an expert adviser to several national organisations. He is a Council Member for the British Association of Head and Neck Oncologists and the British Laryngological Association. He was awarded the Fellowship of the Royal College of Speech and Language Therapists in 2018 and an MBE in the 2022 Queen's New Year Honours in recognition of his contribution to the profession.

Dr Sue S. Yom, MD, PhD, MAS, FASTRO, FAAWR, FACR is the Vice Chair of Strategic Advisory and the Irwin Mark Jacobs and Joan Klein Jacobs Distinguished Professor in the Departments of Radiation Oncology and Otolaryngology - Head and Neck Surgery at the University of California San Francisco. She is Editor-in-Chief of the International Journal of Radiation Oncology Biology

Physics, Chair of the NRG Oncology Head and Neck Cancer Committee, and Board Member and Guidelines and Protocols Committee Co-Chair for the Head and Neck Cancer International Group. She is Immediate Past President of the American Radium Society. She is a member of the NCCN Head and Neck Cancers guidelines committee and the Head and Neck Cancer Resource Panel, Education, and Science Education Committees of the American Society of Radiation Oncology. At UCSF, she serves as Co-Chair of the Oral, Head and Neck Site Committee, Contact PI for NRG Oncology, and full member in Molecular Oncology within the Helen Diller Family Comprehensive Cancer Center. She has been author or co-author on over 200 publications in the medical literature. She serves on organizing committees for numerous radiation oncology and head and neck and lung cancer professional societies.

Dr John Yoo

London, Canada

Dr John Yoo is Dean of the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry at Western University. As the largest Faculty at the University, Schulich consists of over 1000 medical and dental students, over 1000 resident and Fellow trainees, 3000 students of biomedical science programs, and 1200 full-time faculty members. Before being appointed as Dean in 2020,

he served as University Chair and City-wide Chief of the Department of Otolaryngology-Head & Neck Surgery from 2006-2017 and the Department of Paediatrics from 2018-2020. He is also the current President of the Canadian Association of Head and Neck Surgical Oncology.

John was born in Seoul, South Korea, and immigrated with his family to Canada at the age of 5. He attended the University of Toronto where he completed his medical degree in 1991 and residency in 1996. After completing his Fellowship training also in Toronto, he joined the faculty at Western University in 1997. His clinical discipline is head and neck oncology and reconstruction, with a particular focus on the management of the paralyzed face. Having hosted five head and neck surgeons from Australia and New Zealand as clinical Fellows has been among his proudest professional accomplishments.

Dr Ben Panizza Rrishane

Ben Panizza, MBBS, MBA, FRACS, FACS, is currently the Director of Otolaryngology - Head and Neck Surgery at Princess Alexandra Hospital in Brisbane, Australia and Chair of ENT Services for Metro South Health. He was born and educated in Brisbane and is a graduate of the University of Queensland. After completing his specialist qualifications in Queensland,

he undertook two years of Fellowship training in Head and Neck/Skull Base Surgery in London, then in Otology/Neurotology/Skull Base Surgery in Italy.

He established the Queensland Skull Base Unit at PA Hospital in 2006 and was its Co-Director until 2017. He has supervised over 30 international clinical Fellows in head and neck and skull base surgery. He was appointed a Professor of Surgery in the Faculty of Medicine, University of Queensland in 2016.

Dr Panizza is also the current Director of the Queensland Head and Neck Cancer Centre, a research collaborative, between the Translational Research Institute (TRI), QIMR Berghofer Medical Research Institute, University of Queensland and the Princess Alexandra Hospital, initially funded by Atlantic Philanthropies and the Queensland Government. He is active in clinical research being the lead investigator in a number of various phase clinical trials. He is committed to developing the next generation of Clinician-Scientists and after implementing a junior doctor Research Higher Degree Program in 2012, has completed 23 MPhil's/PhD's with 5 current. He has authored multiple research papers and textbooks chapters and sits on numerous editorial boards of scientific journals. He also regularly lectures internationally and recently gave the Eugene Myers International Lecture on Head and Neck Cancer at the American Academy meeting.

Dr Panizza is actively involved in specialist societies having organized multiple congresses and hands on workshops. He has been President of the Australian and New Zealand Head and Neck Cancer Society and is the inaugural President of the recently formed Australian and New Zealand Skull Base Society. He sits on the Council of the International Federation of Head and Neck Oncologic Societies as well as the Executive Committee of the World Federation of Skull Base Societies.



Several points require emphasis:

- 1. Authors of research papers who wish to have their abstracts considered for inclusion in the program at the ANZHNCS ASM 2022 must submit their abstract electronically via the meeting website adhering to the submission deadline. Abstracts submitted after the closing date will not be considered.
- 2. Abstract submission is entirely online and paper or facsimile copies will not be accepted. Abstracts will not be submitted by meeting staff on behalf of authors.
- 3. The title should be brief and explicit.
- 4. Research papers should follow the format: Purpose, Methodology, Results and Conclusion.
- 5. Abstracts should not exceed 275 words (excluding the title, author(s) and presenters' name). Any references must be included in this allowance. If you exceed this limit, the excess text will NOT appear in the final program.
- 6. Include author(s) and indicate presenting author.
- 7. Include details of main institution.
- 8. Abbreviations should be used only for common terms. For uncommon terms, the abbreviation should be given in brackets after the first full use of the word.
- 9. Presentations (slide and video) will only have electronic PowerPoint support. Audio visual instructions will be included in the correspondence sent to all successful authors.
- 10. A 50 word CV is required from each presenter to facilitate their introduction by the session chair.
- 11. The timing (presentation and discussion) of all papers is at the discretion of the organising committee.
- 12. Tables, diagrams, graphs, etc CANNOT be accepted in the abstract submission. This is due to the limitations of the computer software program.
- 13. Please do not type in your abstract onto the submission page. Being internet based, each page on the submission site can only be open for 15 minutes before closing. Type your submission on a text document (eg. Microsoft Word) and copy and paste it into the abstract text field.
- 14. Authors must be registrants at the meeting to present and for their abstract to appear in the final program and on the meeting website.
- 15. Amendments to abstracts after submission is not guaranteed.

The submitting author of an abstract will ALWAYS receive email confirmation of receipt of the abstract into the submission site. If you do not receive a confirmation email within 24 hours it may mean the abstract has not been received. In this circumstance, please email anzhncs.asm@surgeons.org to determine why a confirmation email has not been received.

Important Note Regarding Disclosure of Potential Conflict of Interest

ANZHNCS policy requires disclosure of all financial relationships between a speaker and the commercial supporter (if applicable) or with the manufacturer of any product or class of products they plan to discuss. This policy is designed to provide the audience with an opportunity to review any affiliations between a speaker and supporting organisations for the purpose of determining the potential presence of bias or influence over content.

This policy is not intended to prevent a speaker with such an affiliation or relationship from participating.

Disclosure should be made using a slide at the beginning of your presentation.

Examples of relationships which should be disclosed include but are not limited to:

- any direct financial interest in a company whose interests are in the area(s) covered by the educational material
- investments held by the speaker in a relevant company membership on a relevant company's advisory board or similar committee
- current or recent participation in a clinical trial sponsored by a relevant company
- assisting in the design of clinical studies concerning the use of products manufactured by a relevant company
- participating in clinical studies using products produced by a relevant company
- research by the speaker sponsored by a relevant company
- paid speaker by a relevant company
- the speaker holds a patent for a product referred to in the presentation or marketed by a relevant company. To ensure that audiences receive complete information, speakers who have no involvement with industry should inform the audience that they have nothing to disclose, i.e. cannot identify any potential conflict of interest.

Oral Presentations

Electronic PowerPoint presentations must be provided to the speaker support staff at the Gold Coast Convention and Exhibition Centre. Presentations are required a minimum of 2 hours prior to the commencement of the assigned session.
