Other than the changes of the ex-officio positions, there have again been no significant changes to the make-up of the Board nor the Scientific Committee. None are anticipated in the coming year, however members are encouraged to approach the Borad or Society Executive members if you are willing to make a contribution. A non-clinical or community representative on the Foundation Board, and New Zealand representation on the Scientific Committee has not been found since the last AGM.

Fundraising

All of the contributions to the Foundation in the last 12 months have been either from member donations and modest contributions from workplace giving. The Treasurer reported a significant improvement in the Foundation's financial position over the previous financial year, but the reality is that the difference is due to a large substantial donation from an individual. In the previous calendar year, the majority of donations were directed to the Trudi Shine Adenoid Cystic Fund and again we are grateful for the ongoing support of Doug Strain, Trudi's family and friends. We are looking forward to the Gala Ball in November, with proceeds to be shared between the Foundation and Head and Neck Cancer Australia. It is a sold-out event, but those too slow to have acquired





tickets are encouraged to check out online items, or simply to make donations to bolster the outcome of the event. I remind members also of the mechanism allowing donations to the Foundation at the time of membership renewal – a donation of \$100 from each member would allow at least ongoing grants totalling \$20000 a year. Fundraising activities are also taking place throughout the ASM, particularly at the meeting dinner.

At the end of the financial year, the Foundation's net assets were held \$88 854, a slight increase over the previous year, so once again there are still sufficient to offer modest grants in the coming year.

Grants

The grants process was repeated this year, in that applicants were invited to submit initially an expression of interest. 11 applications were submitted, 9 for the general fund and one each for the Lauren Barrett Fund and Trudi Shine Fund. Four invited to submit a full application. Two unfortunately did not proceed because of late ethics applications and discussions have beed had at our most recent Board meeting to try and ameliorate this issue in later years.
